

Guéridon Bas

Jean Prouvé, 1944



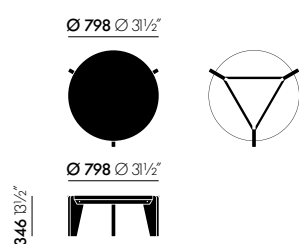
In the early 1940s, Jean Prouvé began to work more extensively with wood. The Guéridon Bas table has a heavy top in solid oak or American walnut resting on three legs in the same wood. These elements are joined together by a robust construction made out of bent sheet metal. Guéridon Bas is also available with

a dark finish, harking back to an original version made of tropical wood known as the 'Table Africaine'.

Materials

- **Table top:** solid wood; oak, natural, oiled finish; oak, dark, oiled finish, or American walnut, natural, oiled finish.
- **Base:** legs matched to table top; solid wood; oak, natural, oiled finish; oak, dark, lacquer finish, or American walnut, natural, oiled finish; connecting element: bent sheet metal, powder-coated (smooth) in deep black.
- **Origin of wood:** oak (*Quercus robur*) from Western Europe and/or Poland; American walnut (*Juglans nigra*) from the USA.
